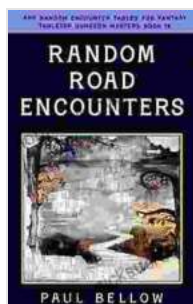


Useful GM Guide: RPG Random Encounter Tables for Fantasy Tabletop Dungeons

How to Use Random Encounter Tables

Using random encounter tables is simple. Just roll a die to determine the type of encounter you'll have, and then consult the table to see what you encounter.

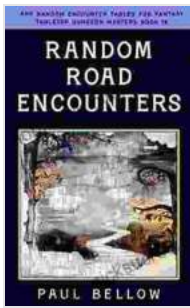

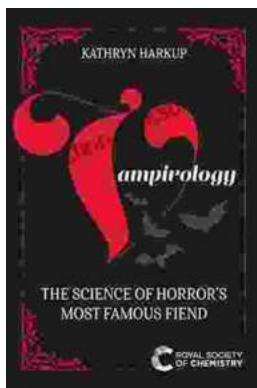
